



EXPRESSION OF INTEREST: CAPACITY ASSESSOR TRAINING

What is a 'capacity assessor'?

A 'capacity assessor' is someone who is designated to determine whether an individual is mentally incapable of certain types of decision-making as described in the *Substitute Decisions Act*. In some circumstances, the *Substitute Decisions Act* gives capacity assessors the exclusive authority to make such determinations.

The Ministry of the Attorney General, Capacity Assessment Office is accepting expressions of interest from qualified persons to train to become a designated capacity assessor under the *Substitute Decisions Act, 1992*. Assessors are fee-for-service practitioners.
